## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

**A**s the pandemic has slowed down, the parish is once again paving its way to normalcy. Our parish is a welcoming community where the diverse gifts of each are brought together in the spirit to produce a vibrant congregation sharing God's love for one another and the world. Our 23 communities and nearly 100 clusters are reviving, thanks to the abilities and support of the community animators and members, who strengthen it with their physical presence. The different cells have started working hard, walking faithfully, growing in unison and drawing closer to one another and Christ. Meeting and greeting the faithful soon after the Eucharist gives one a joyful opportunity to get to know and interact.

It was just last year in June 2021 that Fr. Glasten and I joined the Salvation parish clergy team of Fr. John, Fr. Leslie and Fr. Joel. A year has passed so quickly bringing in the new academic year. Even before we could get to know one another and the history of the parish; Fr. Leslie and Fr. Joel had to move to other parishes leaving the baton in our hands. They were strong pillars who were familiar

with the parishioners and the specifics of the parish. Our clergy team misses them for the support and enthusiasm they brought to the ministry. In the beginning August 2022, Fr. Joel Pinto and Fr. Joseph Pimenta have joined the parish family adding to the clergy team new vigour and strength. Sadly, they missed the Vianney day celebration hosted by the parishioners. Children, youth and elders felicitated the clergy with flowers, spiritual bouquets and cards. The time of fellowship including the cultural program by the various groups and the delicious afternoon meal brought us priests' great joy.



Our parish responded well to the Holy Father's call towards the synodal Journey in which the whole church is engaged. We move ahead in our parish with the synod theme of communion, participation and mission. The parish team did a good job of collating the responses that came from participants from various walks of life. Further, with all the responses from the parishes, the

Archdiocesan synod was held at the Seminary on 2nd - 3rd June and the national synod was held at Bengaluru from 26<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> July 2022.

The Holy Week and Easter enthusiasm, as well as a few significant feasts like Pentecost, the Holy Trinity, and Corpus Christi, helped us all to get rejuvenated over April and May. The celebration of the church cross and the Rosary around the crosses in the communities throughout May were joyful occasions that drew the faithful together. On Laity Sunday the faithful were reminded and briefed on the variety of ministries through which individuals can live out their baptismal call. The lectors, cantors, altar servers, and altar care ministry make the liturgies alive and meaningful; some others reach out to the needy the downtrodden the sick the less privileged by joining the SVP or senior care; still, others extend support to the wider world to witness God's love in building bridges with the socio-political world creating communal harmony, join the BCS, Inter-religious dialogue cell, civic and political cell. Some participate in prayer groups and Bible study, and others work with the parish children and youth. God's boundless love for us is what we are called to share with the world. There is immense power when a group of people with similar interests come together to work towards a common goal by using their talents for the greater glory of God.

A World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly was observed on July 24 in the church and was well appreciated. Children in the community were given an opportunity to strengthen family ties by reaching out to the elderly and remembering their contributions to society. On Sunday, July 31, in observance of the feast of St. Joaquim and Anna, communities had the chance to revitalise the sense of family bonds and togetherness through the zonal celebrations of parent's day. Given that families built on a solid marriage constitute a domestic church, fostering stronger family relations through various church efforts needs to be given

importance. In the near future, the family apostolate (cell), which had slowed down because of the pandemic, will need to be gradually revamped.

The children's Mass and Catechism classes have commenced and are taking shape. Youth are still to show their presence at church in large numbers. The lockdown period is over and we need to return to the Sunday Eucharist to get connected with Christ's Eternal sacrifice. With the help of the PYAT, we are hopeful to soon meet the vibrant, enthusiastic youth in their respective communities. The initial meetings have begun displaying a good start. The PPC and steering committee members are doing their best to ensure that families attend the community and cluster meetings in order to foster stronger ties and a sense of community that will enhance relationships and spread love and life. All community and cluster events must include a special place for the young and the old. Celebration of the "building or Wadi patron feast" termed cluster celebration are very motivating events. This annual celebration can be further enhanced by regular monthly cluster gatherings to share the joys and suffering of one another around the scriptures. It is the community of communities that will bring meaning to our Christian life and that is what we strive for. Rudolf Steiner has a beautiful description of healthy spiritual life "A healthy spiritual-social life is found only, when in the mirror of each soul the whole community finds its reflection, and when in the whole community the virtue of each one is living."

Let us all as one Christian body work towards a community where the needs of the individual and the needs of the group are addressed and met. This will be possible when we all ensure that the Small Christian Community spirit is strengthened through all the parish, community and cluster events.

# SYNOD 2021-23

## For a Synodal Church: Communion | Participation | Mission (Report on the Synodal Journey of Church of Our Lady of Salvation, Dadar)

**T**he Church of God is convoked in Synod. With this convocation, Pope Francis has invited the whole Church to question itself on synodality: a decisive theme for the life and mission of the Church.

The fundamental question guiding this consultation of the People of God is: *A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel 'journeys together': How is this 'journeying together' happening today in your particular Church? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our 'journeying together'?*

At our Parish, the Synodal Journey was taken forward through interactions between the Priests, Religious and the Lay Faithful at various levels – The PPC, The SCC's, Cells and Associations (Renewal Seminar with Bishop BartholBaretto) as well as through individual feedback. The Synodal Core Team was formed comprising Fr. Calistus Fernandes, Benedict Mascarenhas, Sr. Victoria Gonsalves, Magdalene Mendes, Ryan Fernandes & Craig D'Souza in order to facilitate the process and collate the findings. The Sessions involving the PPC, SCC's, Cells and Associations focussed more on Group Discussions and collation of the feedback and suggestions. In order to also get individual feedback, so that no one is left out (which is the important objective of the Synod), online questionnaire was set up using Google Forms. For those not conversant with Google Forms, a printed questionnaire was also simultaneously made available, so that anyone wishing to participate had an opportunity to do so.

About 175-200 participants from our Parish got themselves involved in the process; considering some overlap of members across different groups and not including those who may have sent their feedback directly to the Archdiocese. The

individual feedback comprised 65 Parishioners of which 47 were female and 18 male participants. Out of these individual participants, there were 6 school/college students, 33 working parishioners, 12 home-makers and 14 Retired parishioners, thus providing a reasonable representation of the demographics. The feedback covered 20 different questions on the overall aspect of journeying together including areas of listening, speaking out, teamwork and co-responsibility, celebration and participation to list a few. The questions focussed on assessing the current situation as well as suggestions for going forward in these areas.

At an overall level, while reasonable satisfaction was expressed in various ways regarding the journeying together in our parish, some needs were expressed in terms of listening with empathy in a non-judgemental manner, ability to speak out without being misunderstood, greater involvement of the clergy and religious in the lives, concerns and expectations of the lay faithful as well as greater involvement of the lay faithful as collaborators in this 'journeying together' through participation in various activities, getting involved in Cells and Associations, SCC's and Clusters to make the Parish more vibrant, participative and well represented.

Our Parish has submitted a 37-page detailed report covering Verbatims as well as Outcomes of the various Group Discussions to the Archdiocese for further deliberations at the Archdiocesan level. The next steps would involve further deliberations at various levels in order to understand and implement the suggestions - both at a Parish Level and the Church at an overall level.

# BLOOD DONATION DRIVE IN THE NEW NORMAL

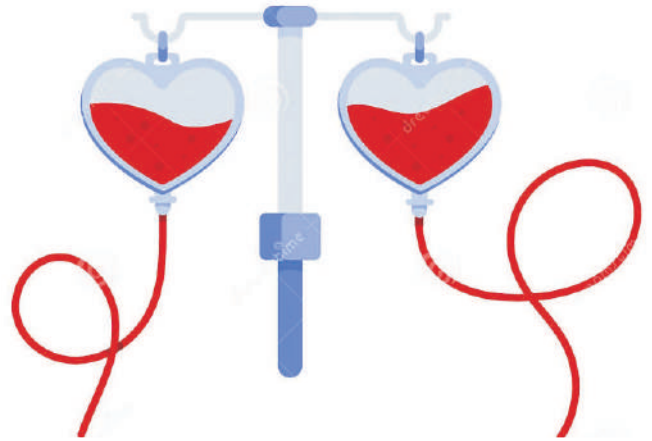

The Legionaries organize this drive every year during the season of Lent. However, this time it was different as Coronavirus halted all the selfless service of the Legion of Mary. After a gap of 2 years this blood drive was planned and executed.

Initially, there was an uncertainty about the turnout of donors but an amazing response was received from our parishioners. The drive which was held on Palm Sunday saw 78 persons registering themselves.

The Blood donation procedure included a basic health screening to filter out the people who were eligible to donate blood. As they say, “Every donor is a Life saver” and thus, we had 57 of them. A snack and a Certificate of Appreciation was given to each donor. Their donor cards will also be handed out shortly.

At the onset of his service - He was put in charge of the cemetery and played an important role in identifying lost graves that were buried underground. He did his job with great efficiency; he was very meticulous in maintaining records. Whatever work or task he took up he did it with great dedication and perfection. He was also a member of the Dadar A.A group since the late 70's. As a beacon of the A.A his contribution is too large to fit into words. He helped so many people transform their lives and overcome alcoholism.

Paul the master of ceremonies made so many people's special day even more special with his grace and humour. As many will remember he was one of the best Compere's around - the passion, flair and panache with which he handled a gathering was unmatched. Senior citizen picnics and parties were always incomplete without the vibrant voice of Paul calling out the numbers in his signature style. Paul was also very passionate about maintaining the heritage cross situated in front of Joseph Mansion ever since he was a young boy. He would get the community to gather there every month of May and would encourage the little ones to come forward to recite the Rosary. He also took it upon himself to procure the survey papers of the cross to ensure that it would not be demolished at the time religious structures were being targeted.

His love and affection was not merely limited to his kith and kin. He loved to meet people. His quest for

knowledge always led to great conversations with people known and unknown.

To his friends and family he was someone who they could always turn to for advice and counsel. We will always miss his great sense of humour and ability to lucidly narrate anecdotes and stories. I am sure many will have pleasant memories with him that will always be cherished! He will always be remembered as someone who gave back so much more than he took!

Paul Fernandes was one of a kind. He has contributed immensely to our society in many ways. All we knew was that he was an ex-Principal, so yes he was expected to be stern & strict, But behind all that emerged a Loving, caring, helpful and yes naughtily smiling Priest.

Full of enthusiasm, a stickler for Perfection, he led from the front. I am sure most of us will have our own fond memories of time with Fr. Leslie, so do I.

I worked in his team as a SVP member, a pandemic volunteer, a lector and was blessed to learn from his meticulous planning and executing of any and every job undertaken by him.

His love for the poor & marginalised could be seen in the way he tirelessly arranged for & distributed foodgrains to needy families in Dadar, Worli & other neighbouring parishes during the Pandemic. He would not hesitate to dig into his own pocket if an emergency arose, cos he always said " God will provide ". He went out of his way to help solve the problems of those struggling with hospital bills - even calling up the Nuns in charge & following up till the end.

We glimpsed the love for his Vocation in his selfless act on Maundy Thursday this year, as he washed & kissed the feet of 12 physically challenged parishioners - a 1st in this parish.

Fr. Leslie's silent dedication to his Priesthood didn't go unnoticed, as he went about sick calls, confessions (once even keeping the congregation waiting for mass to begin as he finished hearing the last 2 in line). During the Pandemic, once the Church doors reopened, his perfect planning

ensured that The Eucharistic Celebration could be attended by people from all over & on special occasions he would sit with us volunteers through all the masses, giving us the support we all needed.

In today's day, when the old & aged are left alone, we can take a leaf from his book. His genuine affection, his listening ear & meaningful deeds towards his aged Parishioners & Priest brethren can teach us a lot. His regular visits & meals at Clergy Home on Vianney Sunday, Maundy Thursday, etc spending time with our ailing or elderly priest is a lesson for us to respect and take care of our aged parents.

His little acts brought joy to the aged parishioners which cannot be expressed in words. He was the walking stick for our young & old parishioners, prodding all to take that extra step knowing that Fr. Leslie was there to help n guide them along if they faltered.

We, the parishioners will have countless more incidents to narrate and remember & I am sure these incidents will not permit us to say Goodbye or Farewell, but will forever keep the bond between Goregaon & Dadar alive. We thank the PPC Executive Committee for the good planning and execution of this program in short notice time and also thank the Board of Management for all the support and help.
